**\* Transfer Credit/General Notes:**

- CSU courses are offered in multiples of 3 semester hours. If credit hours outside of 3 semester hours are transferred, additional CSU credit or supplemental transfer credit may be needed to make up the difference.
- Direct transfer credit for a Major Requirement, Program Electives, or General Education course requires the transfer course to be a minimum of 3 semester hours.
- A grade of “C” or higher is required for English Composition and Math category credit.
- General Psychology is required in the BS Criminal Justice Administration – Arson Investigation degree plan.
- Credit awarded is subject to active NCCRS credit recommendations at the time of completion and program director review. Any courses not included in this agreement will be reviewed for transfer credit based on the recommendations provided by NCCRS and CSU program directors.
- The maximum amount of FDNY transferable semester hours stated in the Program Specific Crosswalks section is only possible if the credit fits the applicable degree categories within the chosen CSU degree program.
- Credit awarded is subject to degree requirements at the time of enrollment and current transfer credit policy, which are subject to change.
- CSU is in the process of converting to new course numbers and anticipates completion by the end of 2022.
- Actual number of transfer credit hours awarded (and therefore the number of hours to be completed at CSU) will be based on actual courses completed successfully at FDNY for which there exists a CSU equivalent and could be more or less than the number of transfer credits in the example above. Please note, the maximum amount of transfer credit allowed in the Columbia Southern University associate’s degree is 45 hours, bachelor’s degree is 90 hours, and master’s degree is 18 hours.

**\*\* Paramedic Credit Notes:**

- Only the most advanced EMS certification will be considered for transfer to CSU degree program.
- New York State or NREMT license and the FDNY training log must be submitted for possible transfer credit to undergraduate CSU degree programs.
- Admission to the Associate of Science in Emergency Medical Services degree program and possible paramedic transfer credit to the Paramedic Core category will be considered with an active NREMT or New York Paramedic license.

\*\*\* CSU students cannot receive both the undergraduate and graduate transfer credit possible for the FDNY Officers Management Institute (FOMI) (MNG 460) program within the same CSU degree program. If enrolling in the undergraduate program, only undergraduate credit will be transferred. If enrolling in the graduate program, only graduate credit will be transferred. If credit is conferred in either an undergraduate or graduate CSU degree program, it cannot be transferred to any other subsequent CSU degree programs.
